This Agreement covers the intellectual property rights pertaining to an Entry to the "2017 ACCES Visualization Contest" ("the Contest").

- 1. To enter the Contest, the Contestant should provide a clear, instructive visual representation, complemented by a pedagogical description of how this representation has been designed for maximal visual effect using Computational Thinking perspectives. The Entry must be based on computationally generated scientific data, such as provided by a numerical simulation, applet or the computational analysis of experimental data. Entries in three different categories are accepted: static, dynamic and interactive ("the Entry").
- 2. The Contest is open to Entries from individuals or small groups (maximum 4) of junior EPFL members (officially enrolled Bachelor, Master, PhD students and post-docs). Recently graduated Master and PhD students can also participate, so long as their Entry pertains to their thesis work.
- 3. The Contestant represents and warrants that his or her Entry is the Contestant's own original work and has not been previously published. The Contestant also represents that his or her Entry (i) does not misrepresent an association or connection to a third party it does not have and (ii) does not contain unauthorized and/or confidential data belonging to a third party.
- 4. For Contestants who are EPFL employees (including PhD students and post-docs), it is reminded that all intellectual property created in connection with their activities for EPFL, respectively by submitting an Entry to the Contest, belong to EPFL (art. 36 Federal Act on the Federal Institutes of Technology).

For Contestants who are not EPFL employees (including Bachelor and Master students), he or she acknowledges that, by submitting an Entry, he or she hereby grants to EPFL a worldwide, non-exclusive, perpetual and irrevocable right, under all intellectual property rights, to copy and, without restriction of medium, to display the Entry. For the avoidance of doubt, EPFL does not claim through this document any ownership of the Entry.

5. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted by the laws of Switzerland. The exclusive place of jurisdiction shall be Lausanne.
