How to scribe

- 1. Take notes during class.
- 2. Download the scribe style file from the course home page.
- 3. Transcribe your notes using Latex, as described in the style file.
- 4. Email the tutor your .tex, .bib file (if you used one), and .pdf file at the latest 4 days after the lecture (i.e. until Sunday evening).

It is *not sufficient* to only transcribe what was written on the board. In between writings on the board, the lecturer verbaly gives explanations, intuition, and other helpful remarks. You must *also* transcribe a selection of these. The goal is to produce a document that someone, who did not attent the class could read and learn from.

The submitted notes will be graded. Recall that scribing one lecture qualifies for 5 bonus points.
